

The Chairman's Stewardship Awards represent the IOGCC's highest honor for these exemplary efforts by the oil and natural gas industry in environmental stewardship.

The award-winning projects represent a few of the many positive programs initiated by domestic oil and natural gas organizations and industry. The intention of the awards is to recognize achievement and challenge organizations, companies and individuals nationwide to demonstrate innovation, dedication and passion for our environment. Stewardship within the industry is one of the great untold success stories and the projects outlined in the following pages represent only a sample of those in operation throughout the world.





AWARD CATEGORIES

Environmental Partnership: The Environmental Partnership award recognizes innovative projects led by non-industry organizations with the cooperation and participation of industry.

Energy Education: This award is presented to a group or organization that has created a program to educate the public about oil and natural gas and the hundreds of ways it affects the lives of Americans each day.

Small Company: This award recognizes an innovative project by a small oil and natural gas company that demonstrates positive environmental stewardship. Small companies are those that operate in a limited area or region.

Large Company: This award recognizes an innovative project by a large oil and natural gas company that demonstrates positive environmental stewardship. Large companies are those that operate nationwide and in many instances internationally.

LARGE COMPANY

Anadarko Petroleum Corp. / Kerr-McGee

Anadarko's Completion Transport Systems (ACTS)

How a company manages water in an oil field located in the parched climate of the second driest state in the nation is a challenge. Eighty percent of all trucks in the oil field are hauling water. A typical four-well pad completion requires 50,000 barrels of water, or 770 truck loads, and 100 completion fluid tanks on location. Anadarko Petroleum Corporation introduced in eastern Utah's Greater Natural Buttes oil field an innovative program known as Anadarko's Completion Transport Systems, or ACTS.

The ACTS program creates temporary staging sites on existing locations to treat completion fluids and move filtered completion fluids by temporary pipelines directly to the next completion site. The program successfully reduced water truck traffic 85 percent, fluid truck traffic 50 percent, and fresh-water consumption 70 percent, or more than 1.6 million barrels of fresh water in 2009. Additionally, the ACTS program reduced road dust and diesel emissions, preserved county roads and improved safety conditions throughout the oil field.



ENERGY EDUCATION

Energize West Virginia

Informing and Educating the Public about Natural Gas Benefits

Energize West Virginia with Natural Gas is a non-profit alliance established in 2006 to gain statewide understanding of the natural gas industry in West Virginia. It is a cooperative venture between two of West Virginia's leading energy associations: West Virginia Oil and Natural Gas Association (WVONGA) and Independent Oil and Gas Association of West Virginia (IOGA). With generous financial commitments by member companies, Energize West Virginia works toward informing and educating citizens about the natural gas industry and the tremendous benefits of this energy source.

Energize West Virginia also focuses on educational programs that allow students at all grade levels to learn more about the importance of the natural gas industry. Additionally Energize WV works closely with vocational, technical and higher education institutions to promote programs to train prospective employees in the industry.

ENVIRONMENTAL PARTNERSHIP

East Resources, Inc.

Remote Water Quality Monitoring Network

East Resources, Inc. donated \$750,000 to the Susquehanna River Basin Commission (SRBC) to underwrite the deployment of a remote water quality monitoring network in the upper reaches of the Susquehanna River watershed. The network will routinely observe and record water quality conditions in smaller rivers and stream flowing through areas of the watershed where oil and gas producers are actively developing Marcellus Shale reserves.

Environmental organizations and local watershed groups have expressed concerns over the potential impact of Marcellus Shale natural gas development on public water supplies and water quality in the Upper Susquehanna River Basin. East believes that the Marcellus Shale can be developed with little impact on water resources. The new monitoring system will provide a valuable service to citizens, communities and watershed groups in the region by informing them about local water quality conditions and helping state and federal agencies respond more rapidly if water quality impacts occur.
